Creative Curriculum— Maafa

This project teaches children about Africa past and present and the development of the slave trade. It also explores Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade, the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa and the worldwide communities that make up the African diaspora. Children will explore a timeline of ancient African kingdoms and then look at how and why the Europeans came to conquer and enslave.
